## **Residential Construction Workers Discuss Housing Issues**

More than 700 builders, remodelers and associates engaged in all facets of residential construction marched on Capitol Hill today [June 7, 2023] to call on Congress to take steps to ease the nation's housing affordability crisis and make housing and homeownership a national priority.



"From coast to coast, members of the housing community have come to Washington for the **National Association of Home Builders (NAHB)** 2023 Legislative Conference to deliver a simple message to lawmakers: 'As housing goes, so goes the economy,'" said NAHB Chairman Alicia Huey, a custom home builder and developer from Birmingham, Ala.

With a nationwide shortage of 1.5 million housing units, Huey noted that "building more homes is the only way to tame inflation, satisfy unmet demand, achieve a healthy supply-demand balance in the for-sale and rental markets, and ease the nation's housing affordability crisis."

In more than 250 individual meetings with their representatives and senators, housing advocates urged lawmakers to act on the following three issues to help keep housing affordable and spur

the production of attainable housing:

#### • Transformers.

A shortage of distribution transformers is delaying housing projects across the nation and the cost of transformers has soared by more than 70% over the past three years. NAHB is urging Congress to:

1) Utilize the Defense Production Act to boost output at existing facilities to address the growing supply chain crisis for distribution transformers, and

2) Oppose efforts by the Department of Energy to increase the energy conservation standards for the production of distribution transformers because it will severely exacerbate the current supply shortage.

#### • Energy codes.

NAHB is urging the Senate to introduce and advance legislation which includes the provision in House-passed bill H.R. 1 that would repeal \$1 billion in grants provided to state and local governments to adopt updated energy codes that are more costly and restrictive. Forcing the adoption of more stringent energy codes to qualify for these grants will exacerbate the current housing affordability crisis and limit energy choices for consumers.

#### • Workforce development funding.

There is a shortage of more than 400,000 workers in the construction industry, and this is resulting in housing construction delays and higher home building costs. NAHB is urging Congress to reauthorize the Workplace Innovation and Opportunity Act to help meet the residential construction industry's severe workforce needs and to fully fund the Job Corps program, which is a vital source of skilled labor for our industry.

## MYBENEFIT LONG TERM DISABILITY ADVISOR BENEFITS REVIEW



Although long term disability (LTD) benefits may lack the appeal of other more often utilized programs in a company's benefit portfolio, for an employee who becomes disabled due to an accident, injury or illness, it becomes a critical and much appreciated safety net.

Designed to replace lost income when an employee is unable to work for an extended period of time, business owners have a choice to provide coverage to all employees as part of an employer-paid core benefit or make the program optional and employee paid, often as part of the company's voluntary benefits portfolio. However, most insurance companies require a minimum level of participation when underwriting an LTD plan, providing an incentive for employers to automatically enroll all employees in the plan and make it a 100% employer paid benefit.

It should be noted that the upside for employees paying for the program with after-tax dollars or paying through a voluntary program is that if they

become disabled and receive benefits, the payments will be tax-free.

LTD plans typically have a waiting period of 90 or 180 days, pay 50-60% of the disabled employee's monthly income up to a stated maximum length of time, based on a very specific definition of "disability". The carrier may or may not include commissions and bonuses in an employee's income. Of particular importance is the carrier's definition of disability. The most liberal definition of the term is "own occupation", which allows the employee to collect benefits if they are unable to work due to illness or injury, in their current profession. On the other end of the spectrum is a definition requiring an inability to work in "any occupation", making it much more difficult for the employee to collect benefits.

The pricing for the benefit program is based on the level of benefits provided, and the demographics of the company's workforce, among other factors. Larger companies and those with prior coverage will usually be required to submit past rate history or utilization information.

For the business owner, it is worth shopping carriers on a regular basis to compare not only pricing but the specific benefits offered by each insurance company, including any exclusions and limitations. Brokers and benefit consultants typically know the best carriers in each region for various industries and can more effectively shop and compare programs for the business owner or designated benefit manager.

## Legislative Roundtable Breakfast 2023 Recap

Recent legislative wins, new bills we support, and proposed bills we must defend against.

The BIA held its annual Legislative Roundtable Breakfast on April 21st at the Lancaster Country Club. Members met with Senators Ryan Aument and Chris Gebhard as well as Representatives Bryan Cutler, Keith Greiner, and Brett Miller in a rotating circuit format, allowing for face-time and conversations with each legislator.

Topics included recent "wins", current legislation that we support and other proposed bills that we need to defend against, and future industry opportunities in this new administration.

#### **RECENT LEGAL WIN WILL NEED A LEGISLATIVE FIX:**

PBA filed a lawsuit against L&I challenging the legality of the 2021 accessibility regulations. PBA was SUCCESSFUL in their court challenge. Currently PBA Members must build to the 2018 accessibility provisions. PBA anticipates participating in a legislative fix to the UCC to allow for the legal adoption of future accessibility provisions.

#### **REINTRODUCTION OF LEGISLATION WE SUPPORT:**

We are pushing for a new package of the Municipal Engineering bills as well as the NPDES Permit Program that were introduced in the 2021/2021 session and must be reintroduced int eh 2022/2023 session.

#### LEGISLATION THAT IS IMPORTANT TO DEFEND AGAINST:

HB 417 - New Home Construction Consumer Protection Act

HB 761 - Contractor Bonding for Adjoining Properties and HB 693 - Adjacent Neighbors' Bill of Rights

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{HB}}$  952 - Adopting zero-emission standards for space and water heaters

#### AN OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR INDUSTRY:

New Pennsylvania Office of Transformation and Opportunity – PBA supports the Governor's creation of a 'one-stop-shop' to help move the backlog of permitting forward in a timely manner; however, we recommend that the following policies also be adopted to help get new projects permitted:

 $\label{eq:1.1} \mbox{Limiting the scope of review for permit challenges} that are able to go before the Environmental Hearing Board.$ 

2. Allowing for Third Party review of permits.

3. Changing PA's NPDES permit trigger for earth disturbance from one acre to the Federal waiver program of five acres.

4. Hold state agencies accountable for missing permit decision deadlines (deemed approval).

5. Pass legislation mandating permit reforms to stop a future Governor from rescinding progress made.
