When was your company started?

Hyland Engineering was founded in 2022.

What does your company do?

Hyland Engineering is a civil engineering firm specializing in land development and site design services. We work throughout Pennsylvania and are also licensed in Delaware. A large area of our focus is stormwater management design and permitting. This can be at local level for a smaller scale stormwater permit, to standard E&S and NPDES permitting, up to Chapter 105 permitting for waterways/wetland encroachments and all the items in between. We work closely with survey, environmental, geotechnical, traffic, and other associated engineering services to obtain full land development entitlement for our clients.



What makes your company special?

Hyland takes pride in building lasting relationships with the people we come across. We focus on being responsive and attentive to the client, while delivering a successful project design/permit approvals in a timely manner. The team at Hyland has an extremely diverse background with land development projects of various sizes and sectors. UPDATES: Remedies in Place for Home Improvement Contractor Resources and Main Office of Attorney General Phone Line, as System Comes Online

HARRISBURG — Attorney General Dave Sunday offered several updates on progress in response to the outside interruption earlier this month that caused outages on Office of Attorney General servers.

Most Office of Attorney General staffers now have access to email, so anyone needing to communicate on those channels is encouraged to do so.

Callers can reach our Constituent Services team at **(717) 787-3391**.

Pennsylvanians may also file complaints via our website, www.attorneygeneral.gov. Complaints are being received, however, there may be delays in processing.

Regarding the Home Improvement Consumer Protection Act, contractors are currently unable to access online their registration, renew their registration, or submit a new registration.

However, remedies have recently been put in place:

An application which can be printed and mailed, as well as instructions are available on the Home Improvement Contractor resource webpage:

(<https://www.attorneygeneral.gov/resources/home-improvement-contractor-registration/>)

For contractors who started a new business after August 8, 2025, and for existing contractors whose registrations expired after August 8, 2025, the Office of Attorney General will allow a grace period for these contractors to register or renew using the online system. This grace period will extend 30 days beyond the online system being back up. Contractors whose registrations have expired will be notified by email once the system is ready to accept online renewals again.

Anyone with questions regarding the Home Improvement Consumer Protection Act can call **(717) 772-2425**.

At this time, consumers are not able to access confirmation of a contractor's registration status.

"We will continue to provide updates on developments with operations. The matter is an active investigation, so we will be limited in details we can provide about the incident," Attorney General Sunday said. "We are proceeding with the utmost caution and consideration to ensure our mission to protect and represent Pennsylvanians is carried out fully and securely."

NAHB Chief Economist Calls for a Rate Cut as Homebuilder Despondence Persists

The Housing Market Index remains stuck at historically low levels

After showing miniscule improvement last month, home builder confidence is back in the doldrums, with August's Housing Market Index (HMI) reading of 32 tying its third-lowest mark since 2012.

The HMI measures builder sentiment on current single-family home sales and expectations for the next six months on a scale of 0 to 100. Based on a survey conducted by the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) and Wells Fargo, any HMI result under 50 indicates a general lack of builder confidence.

The HMI has now been tipped toward the pessimistic side of the scale for 16 straight months. For NAHB Chief Economist Robert Dietz, the malady is housing unaffordability, and the antidote is a Federal Reserve rate cut.

"Housing affordability is central to the outlook for economic growth and inflation," Dietz said in a press release. "Given a slowing housing market and other recent economic data, the Fed's monetary policy committee should return to lowering the federal funds rate, which will reduce financing costs for housing construction and indirectly help mortgage interest rates."

NAHB Chairman Buddy Hughes agreed that affordability is the "top challenge" for the housing market, with many prospective homebuyers waiting for lower mortgage rates before proceeding with a home purchase. He added that builders are "also grappling with supply-side headwinds, including ongoing frustrations with regulatory policies connected to developing land and building homes."

To help combat the affordability headwinds, 66% of builders used sales incentives in August, the HMI survey found. That's up from 62% in July and represents the highest percentage of the post-pandemic era.

About 37% of builders reported cutting prices in August, down slightly from July's 38% mark, with the average price reduction holding steady at 5%.

Regionally, builders in the Midwest are the most optimistic, posting an August HMI reading of 43. The HMI for the Northeast region clocked in at 39, followed by the South at 29 and the West at 26.
